
- In Nov 1947, they were cited for contempt of Congress. In April 1948, each man was found guilty and sentenced to spend a year in prison and pay a \$1,000 fine.





McCarthyism created a climate of fear, not just of communism but also of being labeled a subversive.






'The communists within our borders have been more responsible for the success of communism abroad than Soviet Russia.'

# VICTIMS OF McCARTHYISM

9,500 federal civil servants were dismissed

15,000 federal civil servants resigned while under investigation

2000 industrial workers were fired

3,800 seamen were fired

600 teachers were dismissed

Hundreds of scientists and university teachers lost their jobs

300 were blacklisted in films, television and radio.

500 were arrested for deportation because of their political beliefs

500 state and city employees were sacked


Cold War fears – the growing influence of Communism seemed to support his accusations

McCarthy came across as a patriotic politician fighting dangerous traitors. A defender of American values.


Many Americans felt communism would replace democracy in America.

McCarthy's explanations seemed to be backed up by evidence eg. the atomic spies the Rosenburgs






# THE TRIALS OF THE CENTURY





Whittaker Chambers, a senior editor at *Time* magazine, told the House Un-American Activities Committee that Alger Hiss had been a fellow communist in the 1930s and had given him State Department documents that he passed to a Soviet official.






Chambers produced handwritten memos and typewritten summaries of State Department documents. Experts testified that Hiss had typed both the summaries and personal correspondence on the typewriter. Hiss and experts on his side argued that the typewriter had been tampered with in order to produce the desired evidentiary results.




Chambers had held back from producing several strips of 35mm film and three undeveloped rolls. The existence of this additional evidence ultimately reached the Un-American Activities Committee, which prompted then U.S. Representative Richard Nixon to issue a subpoena for the materials. Under subpoena, Chambers guided congressional investigators to a pumpkin patch on his farm in Maryland. Hidden in a hollowed-out pumpkin was what later became known as the "pumpkin papers"—several prints of State Department documents from the 1930s.





## Was Alger Hiss really a spy?

In 1996, shortly after Hiss's death, a collection of documents were declassified. One of the messages, dated March 30, 1945, refers to an American with the code name Ales. According to the message, Ales was a Soviet agent working in the State Department, who accompanied President Roosevelt to the 1945 Yalta Conference and then flew to Moscow. both of which Hiss did. The message goes on to indicate that Ales met with Andrei Vyshinsky, the Commissar for Foreign Affairs, and was commended for his aid to the Soviets. Analysts at the National Security Agency have gone on record asserting that Ales could only have been Alger Hiss.



When the Russians developed the atomic bomb in 1949, it was believed that Soviet spies must have been responsible for passing the nuclear technology from the United States to Russia.

#### The Rosenbergs

On July 17, 1950, Julius Rosenberg, an electrical engineer and employee for the U.S. Army Signal Corps, was arrested for allegedly passing atomic secrets to Russia

One month later, on August 11, Julius' wife, Ethel, was also arrested, charged with assisting her










The Rosenbergs were executed by the electric chair after two years of prison on June 19, 1953.

#### Were the Rosenbergs unjustly executed?




It is now clear that Julius, an avid communist, had for some time been disclosing U.S. military secrets to the U.S.S.R. from his post in the U.S. Army Signal Corps. David Greenglass, who himself had worked on the Manhattan Project, disclosed nuclear secrets to Julius, who in turn passed the information to Harry Gold — a courier for the espionage ring — who in turn passed it to Anatoly Yakovlev — the Soviet vice-consul in **New York City**
